
#### The International Video

## Airway Responsiveness Satellite Workshop

There have been many scientific and practical issues to consider in the choice of a standard method(s) for testing airway responsiveness as part of ISAAC. Making a decision has proved difficult. Therefore a workshop was organised by Julian Crane, Leader of the Airway Responsiveness Module for ISAAC Phase Two. The workshop took place in Auckland on December 7 1993. Participants included Australians Sandra Anderson & Jenny Peat (Sydney), Colin Robertson (Melbourne); New Zealanders Julian Crane & Robyn Shaw (Wellington), Philip Pattemore (Christchurch), Innes Asher & Ed Mitchell (Auckland); Erika von Mutius (Munich) came all the way from Germany. The workshop considered all the issues and reached a consensus - details to follow in the next newsletter.

# PROGRESS REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ISAAC PHASE ONE IN DORTMUND, GERMANY

We are happy to let you know that we are making good progress with the implementation of ISAAC Phase One in Dortmund. During our preparatory field work we will soon approach officials and schools.

After a meeting with the head of the Health Department of Dortmund we realized that in some areas of the city there is a high proportion of Turkish citizens who might not speak fluent German. To address this problem we decided to translate the questionnaire for parents of 6 and 7 year olds into Turkish; the translation is currently under way.

After the pilot study in March 1994 we will perform the first part of the data collection during the main pollen season, from May 1994 until June 1994; the second part will be done after the main pollen season from September 1994 until October 1994. Each time we will apply 1,500 questionnaires plus the Caucasian video to the 13-14 year olds and 1,500 questionnaires to the parents of 6-7 year olds.

The questionnaires will also include optional questions specifically designed to investigate in more detail smoking habits of the 13-14 year olds and the association between atopic diseases and air pollution from car exhaust.

The other German Phase I Centers are Dresden, Hamburg, Leipzig and Munich. They are in a good position to get funding and they are expected to start data collection in 1995.
